Alexandria Archaeology was awarded \$5,000 to enhance an exhibit named the Lee Street Site to include experiences of free and enslaved African Americans.

The Alexandria Elks Lodge # 48 was awarded \$5,000 to have Tech Painting determine the most effective way to remove peeling paint from the bronze-washed tin ceiling in the lodge room and to remove as much as can be removed with this grant.

The Athenaeum was awarded \$5,000 to tuckpoint the north wall within the courtyard and tuckpoint a portion of the west wall within the courtyard.

History Revealed was awarded \$5,000 for continued support of Shopping Stories Phase 2. This funding will expand the work to Alexandria merchants Robert T. Hooe and his various business partners (1770-1802) and John Mills (1775-1785), Glassford and Company's competitors.

The Lee-Fendall House Museum was awarded \$5,000 which will go towards a Historic Structures Report to be done by professional architectural and preservation specialists.

The Scholarship Fund of Alexandria was awarded a grant of \$5,000 for a scholarship to an Alexandria High School senior planning to study history, architecture or a related subject.
