PLATE EIGHTEEN.



THIS quaint doorway of excellent proportions presents very original details with its wide projecting yet thin cornice, the deep frieze, and stunted architrave. The arrangement and shape of the panels of the door are both unique and pleasing. The arched doorway and the columns and pediment are brought into close relation by the moulded

course just above the door, which is a continuation of the mouldings forming the column capitals. The leaded fan light has an unusual and interesting pattern.

The paneling of the door jambs which follows the main divisions of the door is flush with the rails

and defined by a single bead.
